A Few Interesting Books

A Fellowship Of Differents by Scott McKnight (Zondervan 2014). A rich theological exploration of the church as transformative through its diversity.

Paul And His Recent Interpreters by NT Wright (SPCK 2015). A challenging walk through the story of how scholars have read Paul since the early 19th century.

The Plausibility Problem: The Church And Same Sex Attraction by Ed Shaw (IVP 2015). A British pastor who experiences same-sex attraction argues that his choice of biblically-inspired celibacy is highly plausible, despite what others tell him.

Human Universe by Brian Cox (Collins 2014). Wonder at the way physics has enabled us to explore the universe and discover how a prominent atheist answers the question, 'Why are we here?'

Leadership by Alex Ferguson (Hodder and Stoughton 2015). A mine of leadership insight gained from the Game and taught to many MBA students. You decide how much of this echoes biblical wisdom.
